



## Healthcare Incident Command System (HICS)/ Healthcare Incident Management Team (HIMT) Review Course:

The HICS/HIMT Review Course provides attendees a robust review of terminology, roles, and functions of the healthcare incident command system, and integration of multiple agencies in a unified command such as management teams from healthcare facilities, first responders, and regional partners from qualified instructors and subject matter experts.

The ability to collaborate, coordinate, and communicate in one common operating picture across agency lines during a disaster or emergency event is vital to the overall success of response and recovery.

This course is intended for CVHC members who function in ICS roles in their facility / agency / community response. (Administrators, Command and Operations staff, as well as Emergency Managers are highly encouraged to attend).

This course aims to provide a summarizing understanding of elements from ICS 100/ ICS 200/ ICS 300 / ICS 400 NIMS 700 / NIMS 800.

Participants will complete the HICS/HIMT Review Course fulfilling the following objectives:

1. Participants will obtain basic understanding of Incident Command Structure in Healthcare and Pre-Hospital settings.
2. Participants will review HIMT Chart, including roles and job assignments of staff.
3. Participants will learn multiple Command Center models.
4. Participants will receive detailed description of the "Planning P".
5. Participants will understand the purpose of listed HICS Documents.
6. Participants will actively take part in exercising the ICS structure.
7. Participants will understand key aspects of Multi-Agency Integration and Communication.

A letter of attendance verification will be provided post-course to satisfy documentation records of course completion.
